## OBTAINING YOUR RECREATIONAL PILOT PERMIT

The Recreational Pilot Permit (RPP) program is designed for those who want to become a pilot to fly recreationally or as a hobby.

Although it is the quickest and most affordable route in learning to fly, the Recreational Pilot Permit is more restricted than the Private Pilot Licence.

With a recreational pilot permit:

- Allowed to fly single-engine aircraft with a maximum of four seat
- Restricted to flying VFR with one passenger
- May not be endorsed with any other ratings
- Can fly solo at 14 years of age
- Must be 16 to be licensed
- Must possess at least a Category 4 medical certificate
- Ground school is not required, but recommended, to ensure you will pass the written exam
- Minimum training requirements are 25 hours of flight training
